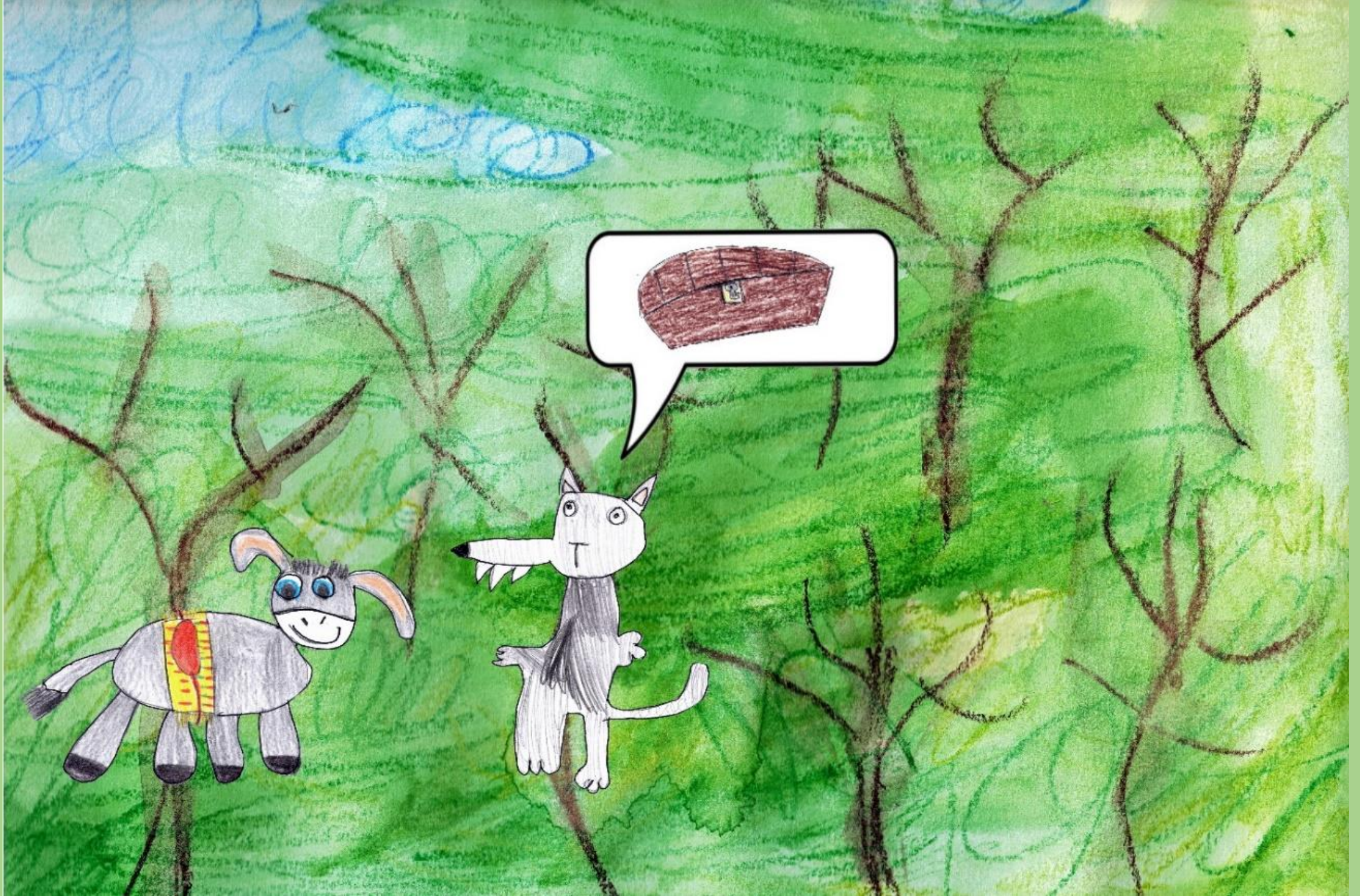

The golden girl gave him the power to fly.

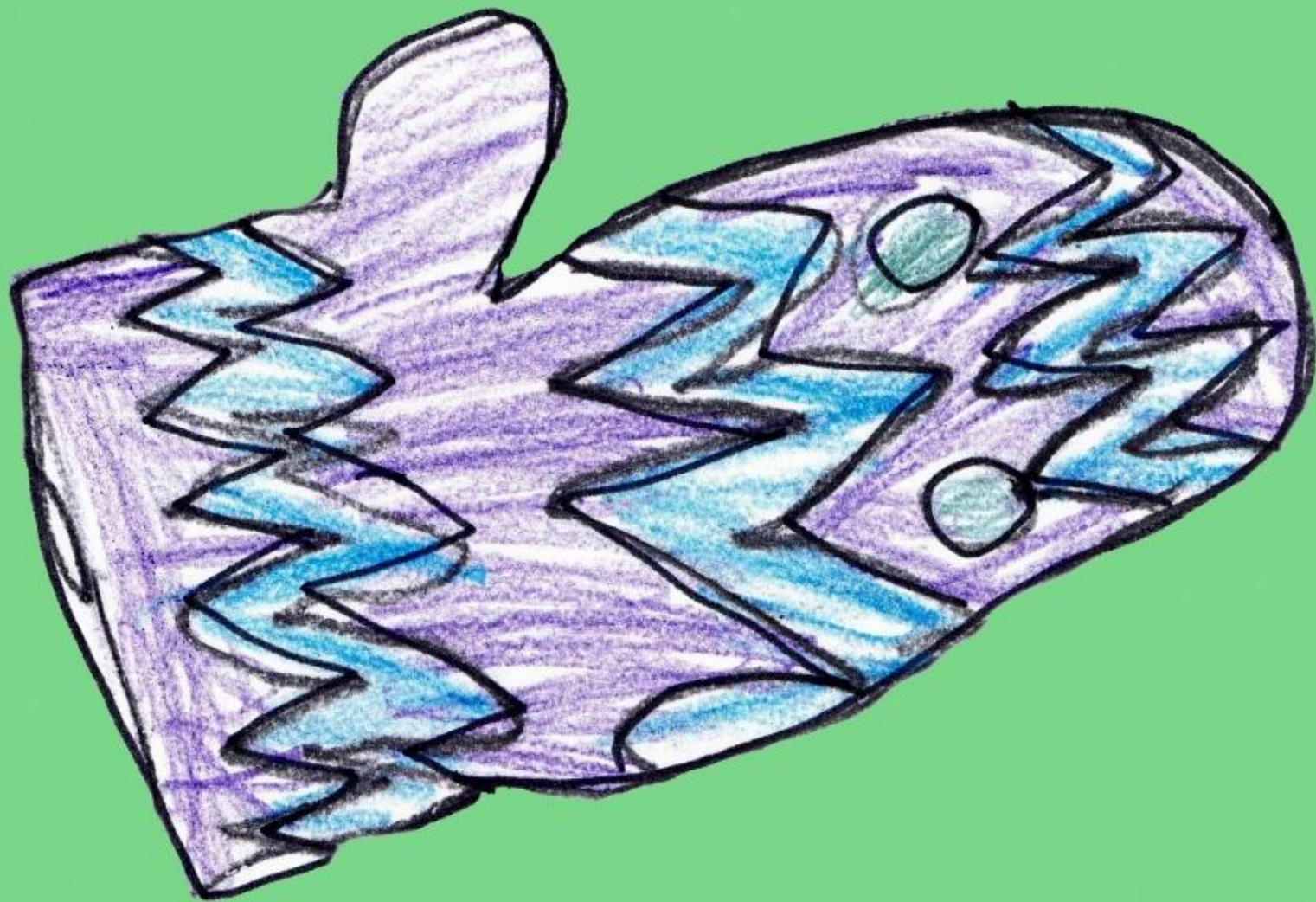
Lisa the pig gave him the power of invisibility.
